AURORA ON SCHEDULE TO GET NEW METERS

The Citizens Utility Board (CUB) is alerting Aurora residents of its online Smart Power Center to help consumers learn more about new digital electric meters that are being installed in the near future.

Commonwealth Edison (ComEd) is upgrading its aging power grid, including installing 61,000 digital smart meters throughout Aurora. The new meters are wireless and send usage data automatically and more frequently. If used properly, they have the potential to save consumers money. Meter installation in Aurora will begin in August and—most likely—finish in December.

"Illinois' old electricity system is unreliable and expensive, but now it's going through historic change, and CUB wants to do all it can to make sure consumers aren't left behind," CUB Executive Director David Kolata said. "If done right, these improvements can make our electricity more reliable and affordable, and we want consumers to have all the information they need to save money."

- Details on energy efficiency incentives, new power-pricing plans and other money-saving opportunities for Illinois consumers;

The service tracks real savings and rewards participants with shopping and restaurant gift cards for reducing electricity usage.
